6:39 **Board Action: Approve Minutes.** Rebecca would like the minutes to change name of Park Clean ups to Sunday Family Park Clean-ups. Change noted. Rebecca motions to approve, Shawn 2nds. Unanimous vote of approval

6:45 April Bertelsen from PBOTand Dana Lucero from Metro give overview and update of Bus Rapid Transit (BRT) project

- -18 mile project to connect Gresham to Downtown with projected route east on Powell to 82nd, north to Division, then east on Division to Gresham. Modelling shows no improvement in commute times with projected route.
- -Near term plan is 1st phase improvement on Division only, 2nd phase will focus on Powell
- Timeline of 2020 has been pushed out further due to modeling data
- -PBOT and Metro encourage feedback on concerns and support for improvements along Powell segment
- -Possible federal funding of up to \$100 million is possible, but project needs to show a compelling story before funds can be applied for.

7:02 Upcoming Elections: Eric gives overview of possible number of elected FoPo board members for upcoming election. SEUL allows up to 15 board members.

Dave Priestap motions for FoPo NA to have up to 15 possible board members, Meg 2nds. **General Membership** votes unanimously in approval.
