6:40 Board Action: Approve Minutes for February 9, 2015 General Meeting

Motion to approve: Christian, Second: Meg

6:45 Information and Discussion: 2015 Events/leader follow up from 1/9/15, Tracy Gratto, At Large Board member. Neighborhood clean up needs volunteers and is coming up fast. A little discussion about how much fun the day of is. We always need help delivering fliers which is also fun and a great way to get to know your neighborhood. We charge for dumping a truck load. Fees are offset from SE Uplift, we get donations and profit from the scrap metal. There is discussion of the garden tour and our need for volunteers and leadership. Volunteers have stepped up to coordinate. National Night Out: we do need a lead volunteer for that. We really need to nail down a lead by May or June. Paperwork, picking up a key, organizing, fliering, Porta-potty, band and vendors. This happens in every neighborhood that can participate and it "takes back the streets/night" and has anti-crime roots. First Tuesday in August (August 4th). **Movies in the Park has been cancelled for lack of leadership.**

7:01 Discussion and Board Action: Transportation System Plan (TSP) update and projects, Dan Campbell, Transportation Chair.

We need to choose things we support:

- **60's bikeway,**
- **72nd Greenway,**
- **Holgate bike lanes broken up into two sections(10-20 yrs) 39th-52nd and 52nd-82nd,**
- **82nd streetscape updates,**
- **possibly an 80's bikeway (not an official part of the TSP yet but being championed by a bike activist) Several neighborhoods are endorsing it. Alot of FP neighbors see a bigger need for the 72nd bikeways if we can only get either 72nd or 82nd.**
- **Bike facilities from 72nd and Powell to I205.**

If we don't pick something nothing will happen. The deadline is in 3 days and Dan chose these because they are in our boundaries. There was some discussion about how to prioritize these projects. There will be opportunities to make choices about how these things are carried out later. Do we want to adopt all 5 or prioritize? Ashe recommends we do not allow the city to prioritize for us. The projects which are endorsed by more than one neighborhood come to the top. Dan does not feel comfortable ranking the projects, just saying the 5 we want. Straw poll: most approve that we proceed with these 5 choices.

Vicki motions that we support the recommendation of these 5 aforementioned TSP projects, Christian seconds.

7:35 Discussion and Board Action: Draft letter of support for traffic calming on 72nd Ave, Dan Campbell, Transportation Chair A letter has been passed around to support this. The area is a cut through and used as an alternative to 82nd. It is also a police cut through. There is property damage and it is very unsafe for neighbors. It's also very noisy. Several neighbors have come specifically to discuss this condition and suggest traffic studies and speed limit signs. The recommendation was written by Ben. There is a plan as part of the TSP. We want to consider endorsing Ben's letter by writing a cover letter from the FPNA. This letter needs to be sent in three days. Meg suggests that language is added to the letter about the speed limit signs. Tracy recommends we send the letter from the FPNA. **Vicki motions to send this letter on behalf of the FPNA, Dan seconds, none are opposed.**
